When I joined Planned Parenthood over a year ago, we were fresh off the fall of *Roe*. Our community was deeply hurt, angry, and scared about the future of abortion care.

When our community needed it most, your partnership in Planned Parenthood's work was critical. Your support helped us continue providing quality and expert sexual and reproductive health care across our region, launch innovative research, facilitate comprehensive sex education, and organize our communities to advocate for health equity.

Health care is a human right.

95,457 patients accessed sexual and reproductive health care at our **health centers**.

13,632 patients trusted us with their medication and procedural **abortions**.

Patients visited our health centers **142,886 times** for **family planning care**.

We administered **217,152 STI tests**, a **25% increase** from last year.

You make health care accessible.

1,762 patients were helped by abortion navigators.

1,283 patients connected with an LGBTQIA+ care coordinator who helped them navigate insurance, understand how to legally change their name, and find support groups and other resources, so they can be their most authentic





We reached **11,635** patients through 17,690 virtual visits and launched new telehealth initiatives including live interpreter services and increased scheduling flexibility.

When education reaches everyone, our community flourishes.

3,183 comprehensive sex education program sessions were delivered to over **60,050 participants** in North Dakota, South Dakota, Minnesota, Iowa, and Nebraska.

Our educators partnered with 259 organizations.

In partnership with the Mayo Clinic and the Landing Day Shelter we launched **URSHI** (Unhoused Reproductive and Sexual Health Initiative) in Minnesota to reach individuals who experience houselessness.

To break down educational barriers PPNCS implemented **multi-session sex education programs**

aimed at people with intellectual and developmental disabilities in Nebraska and Iowa.



URSHI will definitely inform how I treat my patients. I am more aware of the need to destigmatize sex, STIs, and related things, foster a safe environment for my patients to be honest with me, and provide the best care possible.

Engaging and connecting generations of activists.

Young activists **dismantled stigma** and **raised awareness** about reproductive freedom at 20 Generation Action chapters across college campuses.

Organizers, staff, and volunteers connected youth with resources, informed the community of their state-specific reproductive rights, and taught storytellers how to share their patient stories at over 260 organizing events.

Research improves health access and equity.

Our research team was awarded the **Affiliate Clinical and Social Science Award** for centering BIPOC, LGBTQIA+, poor, and rural communities through **31 studies**.

We presented **4 ground-breaking studies** at conferences including our study on health care experiences for trans and gender-expansive patients.

TEAR GAS STUDY SUMMARY

After the police used tear gas at protests after the murder of George Floyd across our 5-state region in 2020, PPNCS' research team sought answers on how tear gas may impact reproductive health. The team analyzed data from over 1,200 people across the United States and published results from a novel study which found a link between tear gas exposure and changes in reproductive health. Our study on tear gas fills a public health gap that we hope sparks further research and radical change.
