What is the difference between the pink Planned Parenthood logo and the blue Planned Parenthood logo?

Pink is for Politics, this is the 501c4, or political arm, of Planned Parenthood. They work to elect and support elected officials that will fight for access to birth control and abortion access. Donations made to the "pink side" are not tax deductible. Blue is for Reproductive health care, this is the 501c3 or the charitable service arm of Planned Parenthood. This is where health care services and Community Education are provided. Donations made to the "blue side" are 100% tax deductible.



How many people get medical care from Planned Parenthood every year?

Nearly 2 million nationally. Nearly 125,000 of those patients come to a local health center at Planned Parenthood of Orange and San Bernardino Counties (PPOSBC).

What is the difference between the national Planned Parenthood and your local Planned Parenthood (PPOSBC)?

Planned Parenthood Federation of America, the national office, work includes nationwide advocacy, public relations, marketing, and research. It does not have health centers. Your local Planned Parenthood, PPOSBC, directly provides medical care and education to local patients in their health centers.

What services does Planned Parenthood provide?

Lifesaving cancer screenings, well-person exams, birth control, STI testing and treatment, comprehensive sexual health education, safe and legal abortion, and so much more! Your local Planned Parenthood also provides comprehensive primary care with Melody Health and breastfeeding and nutrition support with WIC. A list of services can be found at pposbc.org.

How old are most Americans when they have sex for the first time?

At age 17.

About how many nerve fibers are found in the head of the clitoris?

8,000. This is double the nerve endings found in the glans of a penis.

What percentage of women will have at least one abortion by the age of 45?

25%, or 1 in 4.

In what year was Roe v. Wade decided? What year did the Supreme Court overturn it?

Established in 1973, overturned in 2022.

What percentage of Americans disagree with the Supreme Court's decision to overturn Roe v. Wade?

Over 64%.

How much does the federal government spend per year on funding abortion?

Zero. The Hyde Amendment, passed in 1976, prohibits using federal funds to pay for abortion. There are rare exceptions in cases of rape, incest, or to save the life of the mother.

When did birth control become legal for married couples?

1965, and it wasn't legal for all Americans until 1972.

How many women in the U.S. will experience intimate partner violence in her lifetime?

1 in 4.

Once inserted how long does an IUD protect against pregnancy?

The copper IUD is effective as soon as it is put in and lasts up to 10 years. Progestin IUDs can work for 3 to 6 years, depending on the brand.

Is the morning after pill or emergency contraceptives the same thing as an abortion?

Emergency contraceptives cannot end a pregnancy. They reduce the risk of pregnancy by inhibiting ovulation. Emergency Contraceptives help to prevent the need for abortion; it, itself, is not a form of abortion.



When were condoms first used?

Scientists believe that condoms came into use is 11,000 B.C. There are two caves in France known as Grotte Des Combarrelles, or Les Combarelles, that have paintings of a male using a condom during this era.

What is the most common age to start menopause?

51 years old.

How effective are vasectomies?

Vasectomy is extremely effective (it fails less than 1 time in 2,000). But, it can take up to 3 months for it to start working.

How many times a year does the average American couple have sex?

66 times.

On average how many days out of the month can you get pregnant?

The 'fertile window' lasts up to 6 days. You are at your most fertile the before day you ovulate and the day of ovulation. However, because sperm can survive for up to five days, having sex on the days leading up to ovulation can increase your chances of getting pregnant.

What is the recommended age to get the HPV vaccine series?

It's recommended to get the vaccine at age 11 or 12, to be fully protected years before becoming sexually active. If you get all recommended shots of the HPV vaccine before you have sex, it can lower your chances of getting genital warts and cancer caused by HPV by up to 99%.
