A Message from Our Chair and President & CEO

2023 marked Planned Parenthood Hudson Peconic (PPHP)'s 90th anniversary of providing care, no matter what. We entered this milestone year with resolve to continue working towards our mission despite ongoing legislative attacks on reproductive freedoms.

At the time of writing this letter, **22 states** have banned some or all abortions. Abortion opponents have tried to use the courts to restrict access to mifepristone, a safe and





effective drug used in medication abortion. The U.S. Supreme Court recently had the opportunity to be clear in ensuring federal law requires emergency care for pregnant people, including abortion, in every state – regardless of a state's abortion ban – and they chose not to. As a result, the health and lives of pregnant people across the country will continue to be at risk.

At no point in pregnancy is a politician more qualified to make decisions about your health than you and your health care provider. We are grateful for legal protections in New York that protect bodily autonomy. But make no mistake: the reproductive health care crisis is not exclusive to states with abortion bans.

Since the overturn of Roe v. Wade, PPHP has consistently seen out-of-state patients who cannot get the care they need in their home state. We have taken necessary steps to increase our capacity and ensure we can give patients from both New York and across the country the high-quality, compassionate care they deserve. These steps have included health center renovations and expansions, hiring new staff, and launching our mobile health centers in our north and east regions.

We know people should have the freedom to make decisions about their own bodies and lives; we have known this for over 90 years. Our fight continues. We will do whatever it takes to empower the individuals of Westchester, Rockland, Putnam, and Suffolk counties to determine their own sexual health and reproductive futures.

We are grateful for your continued support. You make it possible for us to provide care, education, and advocacy, no matter what. Thank you for being a part of the PPHP community.

Health Care

In 2023, we provided care to over 26,000 patients in our 10 health centers. Through almost 40,000 visits, our compassionate health center teams provided a wide range of sexual and reproductive health care services (see page 14 for a full list of services).

In November, we launched our new electronic medical records system, Epic MyChart, at all PPHP health centers. Our patients can now manage and schedule upcoming appointments, see test results, pay bills, message providers, and request refills, all in one place. We are excited to make the PPHP health care experience even more convenient and seamless for our patients.


This year, we proudly added Apretude to our HIV prevention services, in addition to PrEP **8,047** Abortion visits

2,586 LARCs (long-acting reversible contraception) placed

93 Vasectomies performed

(Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis) pills. Apretude is the first and only long-acting injectable PrEP for reducing the risk of getting HIV. PPHP was one of the first Planned Parenthood affiliates to offer this service.

With continued attacks on sexual and reproductive health care across the country, we have never been more dedicated to providing trustworthy care to our patients. Our doors are open.





Education

Our Education & Training team conducted 636 trainings and outreach programs in 2023, reaching over 4,500 individuals. These programs were offered to young people and covered topics such as healthy relationships, consent, sexually transmitted infections, contraception, sex and technology, and other important issues. We also offered programs for parents and adults working with young people.

We proudly continued expanding our peer education programs, including our Teen Information and Peer Services (TIPS) program for high school students and Promotores program for Spanish-speaking college students. Research shows that peer educators make a lasting impact in their communities, and we are excited

to have given another cohort of teens the tools they need to educate their peers with knowledge and confidence.

The people of Westchester, Rockland, Putnam, and Suffolk counties deserve access to comprehensive, medically informed, and culturally relevant information about gender and sexuality. We are proud to provide the community with the information and resources they need to live happy and healthy lives.

Advocacy

We engaged with over 19,000 activists this year through our advocacy and government relations work in our local counties, New York State, and Washington, D.C. These activities included lobby meetings with elected officials, email campaigns, phone banks, and registering people to vote.

After many conversations with elected officials and activist engagement through our online petition and teach-ins, the New York Equal Rights Amendment (NY ERA) successfully passed in the New York State Legislature in both 2022 and 2023. This means it will appear as a ballot proposal (Prop 1) in November 2024, giving voters the opportunity to embed our fundamental rights and freedoms in the New York State Constitution so they are permanently protected.



It can be easy to think that the reproductive health care crisis is limited to states with abortion bans. This is not the case. There has never been a more critical time to get involved in the fight for reproductive rights in New York. Thank you for standing with us.
