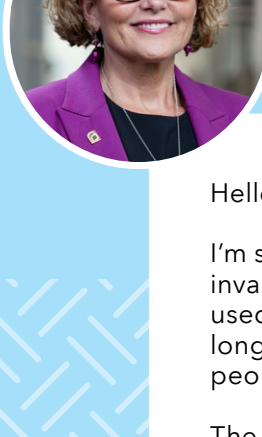

LETTER FROM THE CEO PPMM continues providing medication abortion, despite Texas federal court ruling on mifepristone

Hello Friends,

I'm sure you are as outraged as I am about a Texas federal judge's April 7 ruling to invalidate FDA approval of mifepristone, an abortion medication that has been widely used for more than 20 years and has a 99% safety rating. This dangerous ruling by a longtime religious-right extremist could jeopardize the health and safety of millions of people in every state across the country.

The ruling is clearly not based on science or decades of data. Many legal and medical experts agree that the case should never have made it into court.

However, thanks to quick action taken by another federal judge in Washington state, the Texas ruling is in limbo. And as of today, April 10, there are no operational changes to how PPMM provides abortion care. **Even if mifepristone is banned, abortion is still legal in California and Nevada, protected by state law. But we would have no choice but to shift how this service is provided.**

Should the Texas ruling be upheld on appeal, PPMM will transition to a misoprostol-only medical abortion regimen, and we will continue expanding our capacity for in-health center abortion care.

This will cost us – financially, logistically, and emotionally. But our commitment to our patients will not waver.

I want to acknowledge the important role our supporters play in expanding access to PPMM's excellent abortion care for our patients, especially at a time like this. Abortion Provider Appreciation Day, on March 10, was an opportunity for me to express my gratitude to our amazing staff, and it's another chance to thank you for supporting our efforts year-round, caring for patients from across the country as we constantly work to increase access to abortion care.

There have been other significant events to celebrate over the past month as well. You can read, below, about the ribbon-cutting ceremony we had on March 27 to publicly announce that PPMM is the first health care organization in the country using a new, sophisticated diagnostic testing machine at full capacity. Elected officials, including San Jose Mayor Matt Mahan, came to congratulate us on this important milestone for our patients.

Also, I recently joined our Reno staff and Nevada supporters in Carson City during an uplifting an energetic lobbying day to advocate in the state capital for reproductive rights legislation, including an amendment that will permanently enshrine abortion-access into the state constitution. State laws protecting abortion-access, like those in Nevada, are now being tested like never before. This proposed constitutional amendment to guard reproductive freedom ensures that Nevadans – as well as anyone who comes to our state seeking care – are protected in the strongest way possible.

Just like Prop. 1 in California, the amendment to Nevada's constitution will protect not only the right to abortion, but also a person's privacy and right to obtain birth control, prenatal care, childbirth, postpartum care, vasectomy and tubal ligation, miscarriage management, and infertility care. That is something we can all get behind!

The central goal for PPMM in Nevada is to increase abortion-access by eliminating the state's "physician only" law. Nevada is the only state I've worked in – and I've worked in five states – that prohibits anyone but a physician from providing abortions. We know how training more of our California clinicians to provide abortions has significantly improved access for our patients, and we need to be able to do the same for patients in Nevada.

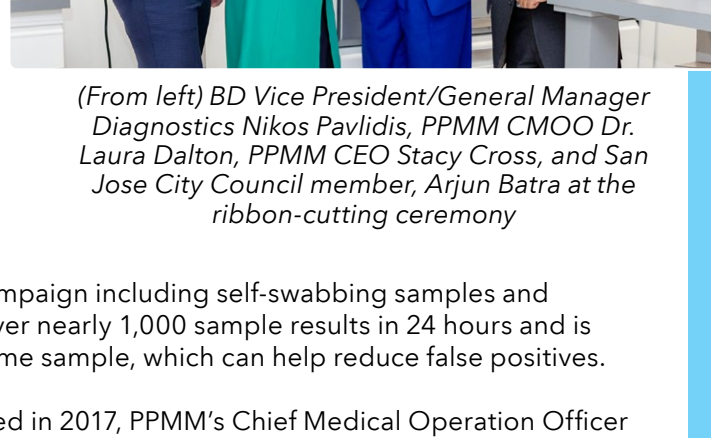
In closing, I want to thank you again for standing shoulder to shoulder with us and our patients to ensure that PPMM can continue to provide essential health care for everyone who needs it, even when extremist politicians and judges are determined to eliminate basic freedoms and bodily autonomy. I know that with supporters like you behind us, this oppression will not stand. We will continue to provide care for all who rely on us.

Spotlight on PPMM lab's new testing machine

March 27 was an exciting day at our central San Jose health center when we had an official ribbon-cutting ceremony and gave public officials a tour of our main lab to announce that we are the first health care organization in the country using a new, cutting-edge medical testing machine at full capacity. It's great news for patients and our mission to promote health equity!

The COR FX/MX System, designed by BD, a leading medical technology company, processes high-quality test results for infectious diseases and molecular testing at a far faster rate and at higher volume than previously available.

The use of this BD technology will allow us to launch a revitalized STI treatment campaign including self-swabbing samples and Trichomonas testing. The system can deliver nearly 1,000 sample results in 24 hours and is able to detect three specific STIs in the same sample, which can help reduce false positives.

When the machine was first being designed in 2017, PPMM's Chief Medical Operation Officer Dr. Laura Dalton was invited to observe and provide feedback on its development. "This is a great example of supporting health care equity," she said. "Our patients deserve access to the highest possible level of care and the highest quality, most accurate results."

Many local elected officials, including San Jose Mayor Matt Mahan, came to celebrate with us at the ribbon-cutting. Big thanks to the donors who also came to take a tour of the lab and celebrate with us!

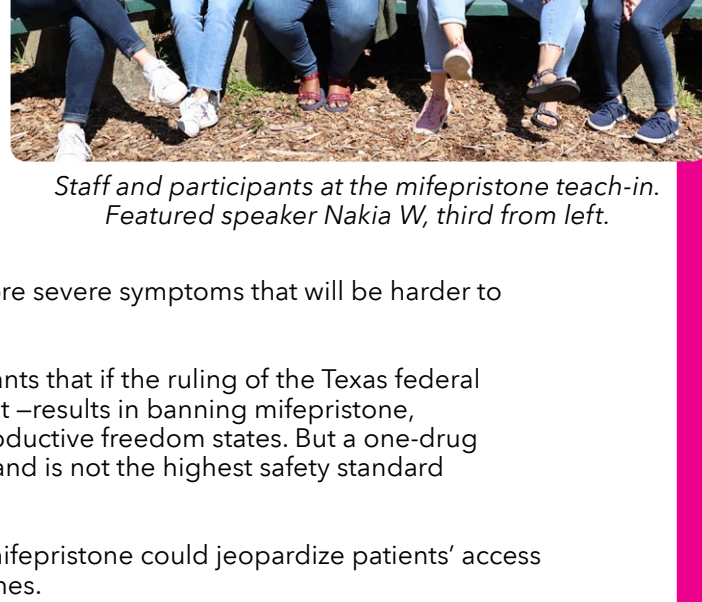
PPMM Public Affairs teach-in on mifepristone Explaining the stakes in battle over medication abortion

Two weeks before a Texas federal judge's April 7 ruling to invalidate FDA-approval of mifepristone, a group of PP supporters showed up at Diamond Park in Oakland to learn more about the importance of the abortion medication, which has been widely and safely used for decades. Through a federal judge in Washington state almost immediately issued a conflicting ruling that upheld FDA's safety approval, it is still possible that mifepristone could be banned – even in reproductive freedom states like California.

Our Public Affairs team sponsored the March 26 "Mifepristone Teach-in" to engage supporters, fill them in about the Texas case, and provide more information about the efficacy and 99% safety record of mifepristone, the first medication in a two-medication regimen for abortion care and miscarriage.

PPMM Alameda County Grassroots Organizer Becca H. and Silicon Valley/Coast Public Affairs Director Dianna Z. came to discuss the far-reaching consequences of eliminating access to the drug, especially since medication abortions now make up more than half of all abortions in the country.

Nine participants showed up for the teach-in, including UC Berkeley PP GenAction student leaders, community partners, and faith leaders. They also heard from guest speaker, Nakia W., a full-spectrum birth worker who provides abortion care and is the former executive director of the California Coalition for Reproductive Freedom.

Nakia told the group that mifepristone and medication abortion has made abortion care more accessible as well as safer for teenagers and people experiencing domestic violence. Eliminating mifepristone from medication abortion means these folks might experience more severe symptoms that will be harder to manage and keep private.

Becca and Dianna explained to teach-in participants that if the ruling of the Texas federal judge – a religious-right wing anti-abortion zealot – results in banning mifepristone, medication abortion will still be available in reproductive freedom states. But a one-drug regimen is not as highly effective for all patients and is not the highest safety standard available.

Teach-in participants also learned that banning mifepristone could jeopardize patients' access to a broad range of other FDA-approved medicines.

The Texas case is clearly another political attack on reproductive rights by far-right extremists who are cynically using the court system to override public opinion that is overwhelmingly in favor of keeping abortion safe and legal.

So, at the end of the PPMM teach-in, participants banded together to write heartfelt thank-you notes to our amazing abortion providers.

Informative events like this are a big part of what inspires our volunteers and supporters to hit the streets to register voters at election time, march at rallies, lobby legislators, and organize on college campuses to protect and promote reproductive rights.

The Oakland mifepristone teach-in group left Diamond Park very well-prepared to spread the word in advance of the outrageous ruling out of Texas.

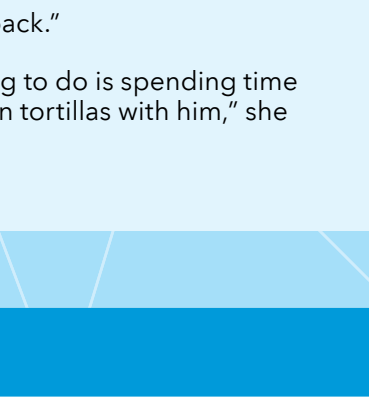
Being Memorable

Making patients feel that PPMM is their health care home RN Patricia B. in Merced

Here's what two patients had to say about the care they received from RN Patricia B. at the Merced health center:

If patients have been waiting a little while before they are seen for their appointment at the Merced health center, RN Patricia B. tells them right away, "I appreciate your time." It's one way she makes patients feel immediately that taking care of them is important to her.

"I like to quickly create a rapport with patients so they feel at ease asking even the most sensitive questions, and that makes them feel at home," she added. "If I can see they're nervous when I'm drawing blood, for example, I ask them if they have any hobbies and start an easy conversation."

Patricia finds that once she has built that rapport, many patients will open up and start asking questions that they may have never asked a health care professional – or anyone – before. Some patients have ended up talking to Patricia about issues ranging from how they can better communicate with their partner to anxiety they are feeling about pending test results.

"It isn't just that people want to have their questions answered, but they also want to feel like they can ask the questions," she says. "In many of these conversations, I just want to remind them of the power they have over their own bodies so that they feel free to make the best decisions for themselves."

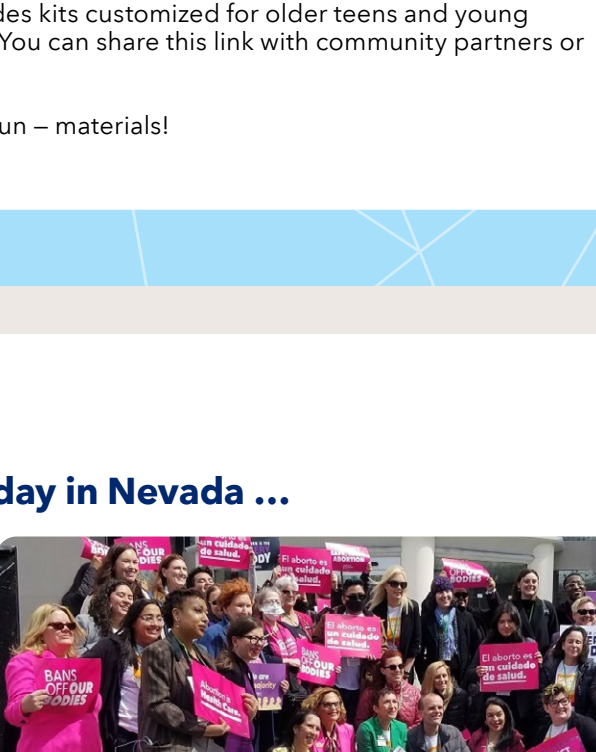
"That is what makes patients trust us and want to come back."

Patricia said that when she's not a work, her favorite thing to do is spending time with her husband and 8-year-old son. "I like to make corn tortillas with him," she said, laughing. "He's getting really good at it!"

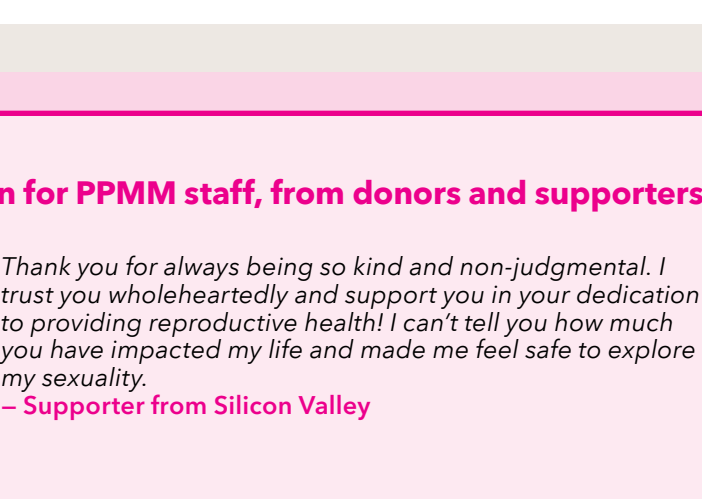

PPMM at "Feminist Roadshow" lobbying day in Nevada ...

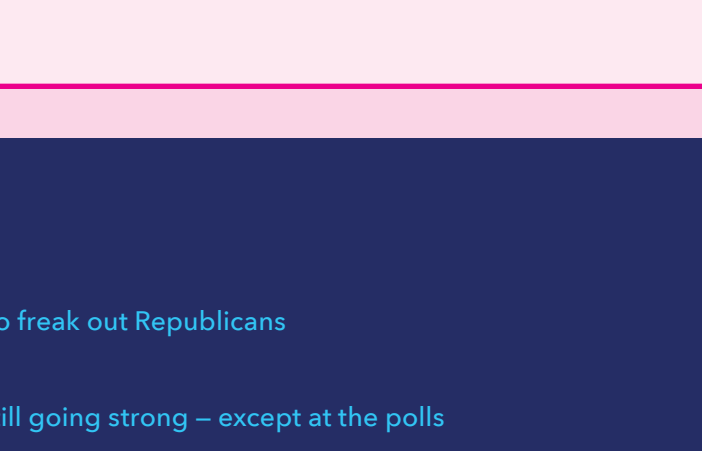
