Leading on Health Equity

Planned Parenthood California Central Coast (PPCCC) is on the cutting edge of innovation, equity, and access to care. Over the summer, we made great strides at implementing several new programs designed to **improve sexual and reproductive health outcomes and reduce health disparities** in the communities we serve.

We're expanding education. We're thrilled to share that PPCCC recently secured a 5-year funding commitment for \$798k each year from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Office of the Assistant Secretary for Health, and the Office of Population Affairs Teen Pregnancy Prevention Program Tier 1 grant. This program allows us to add five new members to the Education Team to serve new evidencebased programs and expand our current reach on the Central Coast. With these funds, we will be implementing two new programs to start; one focusing on parents and teens, and another program designed to reduce health disparities faced by LGBTQ+ youth by teaching youth how to be better advocates for themselves and by training medical and social service professionals to provide care and support without bias and stigma.

We're investing in mental and behavioral wellness. Mental and behavioral health needs have skyrocketed in our region and the communities we serve need more support. We are hiring a Behavioral Health Program Manager to support patients next year who come to us in crisis or with unmet behavioral, mental, or social needs.

We're addressing maternal and infant health. Data shows that U.S. maternal outcomes are worsening, and disparities are growing, especially among Black women, who experience

maternal mortality rates two to three times higher than that of white women. To address the needs of postpartum people and babies, the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists (ACOG) recommends that all postpartum birthing people receive a visit from a healthcare provider

in the first three weeks after birth. We are thrilled to share that PPCCC has secured funding to establish a new home visitation model to support birthing people beginning in Santa Barbara



County. We expect services to commence in June 2024.

We're doubling down on the STI crisis.

Rates of sexually transmitted infections (STIs) have been on the rise for years, and with devastating outcomes. PPCCC is implementing same-day, in-clinic, rapid tests that detect Chlamydia, Gonnorhea, Syphilis, HIV, and Hep C within 30 minutes. With this we will provide expedited treatment to help reduce STI rates in our region.

Health equity and improved access to care is at the center of all we do. We are relentlessly pursuing a future where all people have equitable opportunity to experience health and wellness, including sexual and reproductive health care provided with respect and without judgment.

Lexi Beausoleil (she/her), a Santa Barbara native, is a UCLA alumna with a BA in International Development. With over 15 years of experience in various marketing roles, Lexi currently works in product marketing at the tech startup SOCi, Inc. Before discovering her love of marketing, she traveled internationally as a civic educator with the bipartisan Constitutional Rights Foundation. Since her return to Santa Barbara, she has served the community as a Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) for children in foster care, a member of the PPCCC Young Advocates' steering committee, and a board member for the PPCC Action Fund. This year, she was honored to be elected as the chair of the Action Fund.





Kim Johnson (she/her) is a Marketing and Communications professional with over 15 years of leadership in both the nonprofit and corporate environment. Kim most recently served as the Senior Manager of Brand Purpose for UGG developing and executing against the brand's values related to sustainability, diversity, equity and inclusion. Kim has served on the boards of Worthy of Love and Collegiate Charter High School of Los Angeles as well as a member of the Pride, Corporate Partnerships and Communications committees for Pacific Pride Foundation. Kim was also appointed for a one-year term as a member of the Santa Barbara Community Formation Commission focused on police oversight. Kim spends her free time with her partner and rescue Husky dog hiking, performing improv and hanging with friends.

Carrie Towbes (she/her) is a Licensed Clinical Psychologist specializing in the assessment and treatment of children, youth, and families. Raised in Santa Barbara, Carrie relocated back to the area in 2008. She currently operates a busy independent practice in Santa Barbara with an emphasis on psycho-educational assessment and psychotherapy for children and their families coping with a wide array of challenges from ADHD to anxiety to Autism.

Prior to obtaining her Ph.D. in Clinical Psychology from the University of Delaware, Carrie received a B.S. in Elementary Education from the University of Colorado, a M.Ed. in Special Education from the University of Maryland, and she obtained her Advanced Professional Teaching Certification. As a psychologist, Carrie has worked in schools, hospitals, community mental health centers, and nonprofit agencies.



Carrie has served on a number of nonprofit boards that emphasize services to children and families. She currently serves as the President of the Towbes Foundation, the family foundation started by her parents, Michael and Gail Towbes. Since 1980, the Towbes Foundation has granted approximately \$24mm to well over 400 organizations, the vast majority of those organizations located in Santa Barbara County. The Towbes Foundation is currently focused on grant initiatives in the areas of education and mental health.



Jamie Woolf (she/her) is a retired journalist who spent 32 years writing for The Salt Lake Tribune in Salt Lake City, Utah, covering environmental issues. She received a Knight International Press Fellowship in 1998 and spent six months teaching journalism in Ecuador. She was also a visiting lecturer at Princeton University in 2001.

Since moving to SLO 15 years ago, she has been president of the Unitarian Universalists SLO Board of Trustees; a member of the Growing Together Fund advisory committee; a member of the SLO Police Advisory Committee; chair of SLO City's Bicycle Advisory Committee; a state park docent at the Pismo Beach Monarch Grove; and a volunteer teacher of English as a second language.

She is a proud transgender woman who served as chair of Tranz Central Coast (https://www.tranzcentralcoast.org) from 2018-2022. TCC is a group that supports

transgender and other gender-diverse people in San Luis Obispo County. One of her accomplishments was transitioning TCC from a struggling independent group using the Gala Pride and Diversity Center (GPDC) as a fiscal sponsor, to being a full committee of GPDC, assuring the viability of the group.
