This was an unprecedented year for Planned Parenthood Keystone. We have faced financial challenges, a devastating election, a hostile administration and constant threats to our funding and the care that we provide.

Through the madness and noise, there was still plenty to celebrate. PPKeystone served over 33,000 women, men and young people in our medical centers and 10,000 young people through our Education Department—and has seen tremendous growth in our support and advocacy networks. Plus, PPKeystone celebrated 100 years of Planned Parenthood's commitment to care, education, and activism.

Over the last century Planned Parenthood changed everything about the way our communities live and love, but the progress has been hard fought. Since Planned Parenthood's early days in Brooklyn, to its first arrival in Pennsylvania in 1926 - our mission has faced opposition. As these attacks continue to escalate, PPKeystone is committed as ever to ensure access to essential reproductive health care and sexuality education. Planned Parenthood Keystone has worked diligently to become the leading sexual and reproductive health care provider in our region. As we move forward, we go with the spirit of our predecessors: those who brought Planned Parenthood from Brooklyn to Luzerne County, the dedicated volunteers who worked out of a basement in Harrisburg, the community who fought to

bring abortion care to York County, and the passionate staff and volunteers determined to create a safe space for LGBTQ+ youth in Bucks County.

Thank you for standing with Planned Parenthood Keystone, and the 33,000 people and countless communities who depend on us, and you, each year. With your continued commitment we will be able to honor our past while continuing to fight to ensure every woman, man, and young person has the health care and sexuality education they need to live healthy lives and build strong communities.

Caring For Our Communities

Medical Services

Essential reproductive health care is a constant need for Pennsylvania individuals, and Planned Parenthood Keystone is committed to providing the highest quality care to all patients who walk through our door. PPKeystone provides services to 43% of Pennsylvania residents across 37 counties. Sadly, PPKeystone had to make the incredibly difficult decision to close five medical centers this year. In response, we extended hours and consolidated services in our remaining sites and within those nine medical centers we were able to serve over 33,000 patients.

Advancements & Improvements

PPKeystone has used this last year to ensure our medical centers are as efficient as possible by embracing technological advances that allow us to reach patients in new ways. PPKeystone has worked to bring access to patients' fingertips through Online Appointment Scheduling (OAS) and a digitally-based marketing program. These new ads generate local Planned Parenthood information and scheduling directly from a Google search.

In addition, Electronic Health Records (EHR) were rolled out throughout our affiliate. Electronic medical records make it easier for our clinicians and doctors to access clinical data, maintain effective workflows and improve patient safety. PPKeystone also hired our first Chief Medical Officer. Her leadership will allow us to build out our service menu for patients and increase patient satisfaction and outcomes throughout our affiliate.





Empowering Through Education

PREP & HRC Grants

PPKeystone emphasizes the importance of reproductive and sexuality education inside and outside our medical centers. Through our expertise as sexual health educators, we partner with schools, colleges, treatment facilities, community organizations, faith based organizations, and many others within our service area to provide high quality programming.

In FY16, our Education Department was awarded a Personal Responsibility Education Program (PREP) grant through the Pennsylvania Department of Health. Through this grant, a part-time educator was able to provide the curriculum, "Be Proud! Be Responsible!" This evidence-based curriculum provides adolescents with the knowledge, motivation and skills to change their behaviors in ways that will reduce their risk of contracting HIV.

Planned Parenthood Keystone also operated a health resource center at I-Lead Charter School in Reading, PA. The Health Resource Center encouraged critical thinking around sexual activity, promoted healthy relationships and behaviors regarding human sexuality, provided education and counseling around


abstinence, educated on safer sexual behavior, including correct use of condoms and reduced unintended pregnancies and STD/HIV infection by providing referrals for reproductive healthcare services, contraception, and STD/HIV testing.

LGBTQ+ Programs

Planned Parenthood Keystone's education department is proud to operate 3 LGBTQ+ programs which are located in Doylestown, Reading, and York. These weekly programs offer a safe space for lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, and gender nonconforming youth. The participants are given opportunities to lead and learn in a welcoming and fun environment. The LGBTQ+ programs also facilitate sex education topics, in order to empower youth to make the best choices regarding their reproductive and sexual health.


Advocating For Access


Lobbying & Advocacy

Each year, Planned Parenthood faces numerous attacks and threats to the essential reproductive health care that we provide. Planned Parenthood Keystone partners with Planned Parenthood Pennsylvania Advocates to conduct outreach and events to destigmatize abortion, educate voters on their rights, and to register individuals to vote. Organizers and supporters also work closely with Coalition partners to support other issues such as: immigrant and LGBTQ+ rights, and the Black Lives Matter Movement.

In FY17, Planned Parenthood Keystone saw a dramatic increase in the number of volunteers and supporters engaged in our work. Planned Parenthood organizers and volunteers were instrumental in mobilizing against legislative attacks on the Affordable Care Act and Medicaid reimbursements for reproductive health care at Planned Parenthood. Through this work, Pennsylvania had more Congressmen move from supporting "repeal/defunding" efforts to opposing these actions than any other state in the country.


